The Shema: "The Doctrine of the Heart"

"God is the same Yesterday, Today, and Forever"

The heart symbolizes the center or "core" of our being, from which prayer and moral actions originate.

"Blessed are the Pure in Heart..." "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all your Heart..."
