- **8.** Tor F Isaiah is quoted 68 times in the New Testament, 53 times in the D&C and nearly 300 verses in the Book of Mormon? **FALSE! Double the numbers:** NT = 137, D&C = 106, BofM = 600
- 9. Tor F There are 12 entire chapters of Isaiah quoted in the Book of Mormon?

FALSE. 19 entire chapters. Approx 30% of Isaiah's writings are in the Book of Mormon. WHY did they quote Isaiah SO much? (see 2 Nephi 11:2-4). Also BD Isaiah 3rd paragraph

10. Tor F If all the quoted Isaiah verses were compiled as a book in the Book of Mormon it would be the 4t largest book in the Book of Mormon? **TRUE!**

11. Tor F Our best commentary and guide to understanding Isaiah is the D&C? True...however...there is more...

Tor F As one understands Isaiah he will more fully comprehend the meaning of the Abrahamic Covenant? **True...however...there is more...**

BD Isaiah final paragraph: "...The reader today has no greater written commentary and guide to understanding Isaiah than the Book of Mormon and the Doctrine and Covenants.  - 3. Isaiah 49 (1 Nephi 21; 2 Nephi 6; 3 Nephi 22:1)
 - 4. Isaiah 5:29 (3 Nephi 16:15-16; 3 Nephi 20;16-17; 3 Nephi 21:12-18)
